The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the first step in the financial aid process for United States citizens and eligible noncitizens. The FAFSA is required in order to receive grants, federal and state loans, and work study, as well as some private financial aid. For students who are ineligible to file the FAFSA, the Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA), and the International Student Financial Aid Application (ISFAA), are available.
