The FAFSA is required in order to receive grants, federal loans, and work study, as well as some private financial aid. For students who are ineligible to file the FAFSA, the Texas Application for State Financial Aid (TASFA) and the International Student Financial Aid Application (ISFAA) are available.

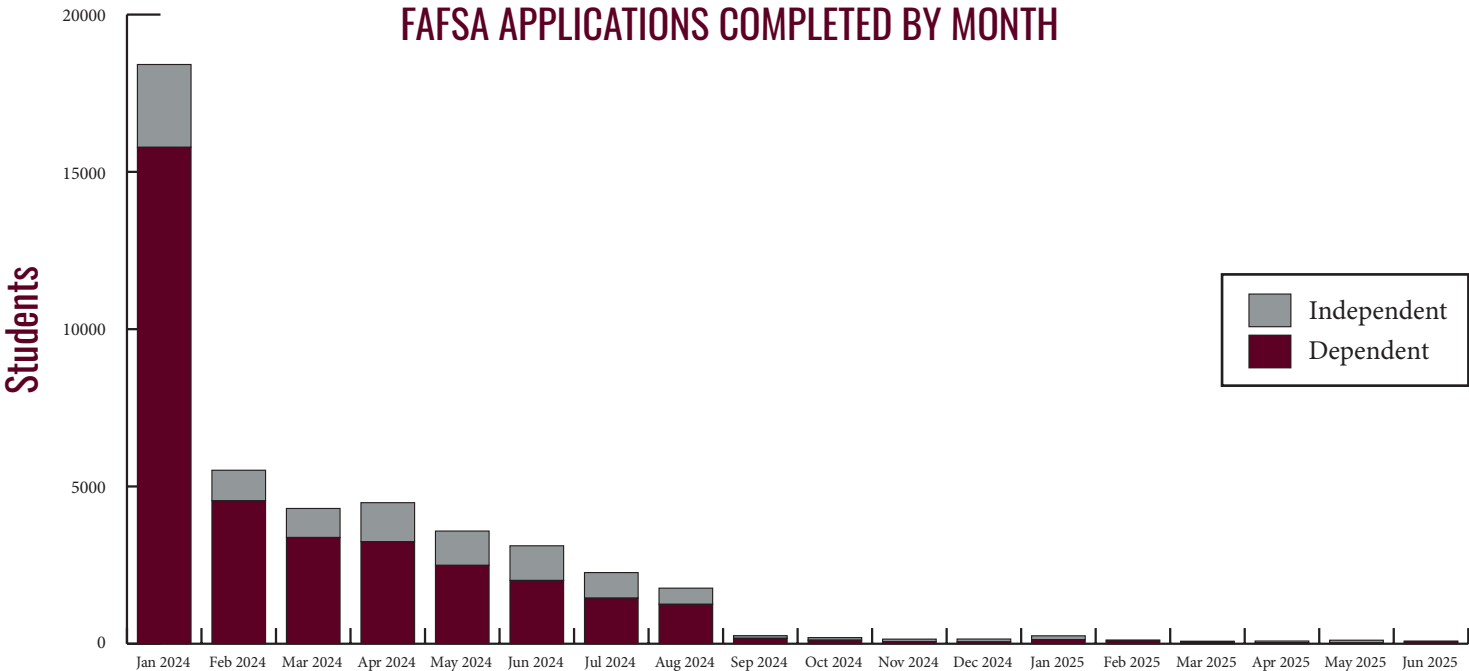
FAFSA COMPLETION RATES
